

Festival History

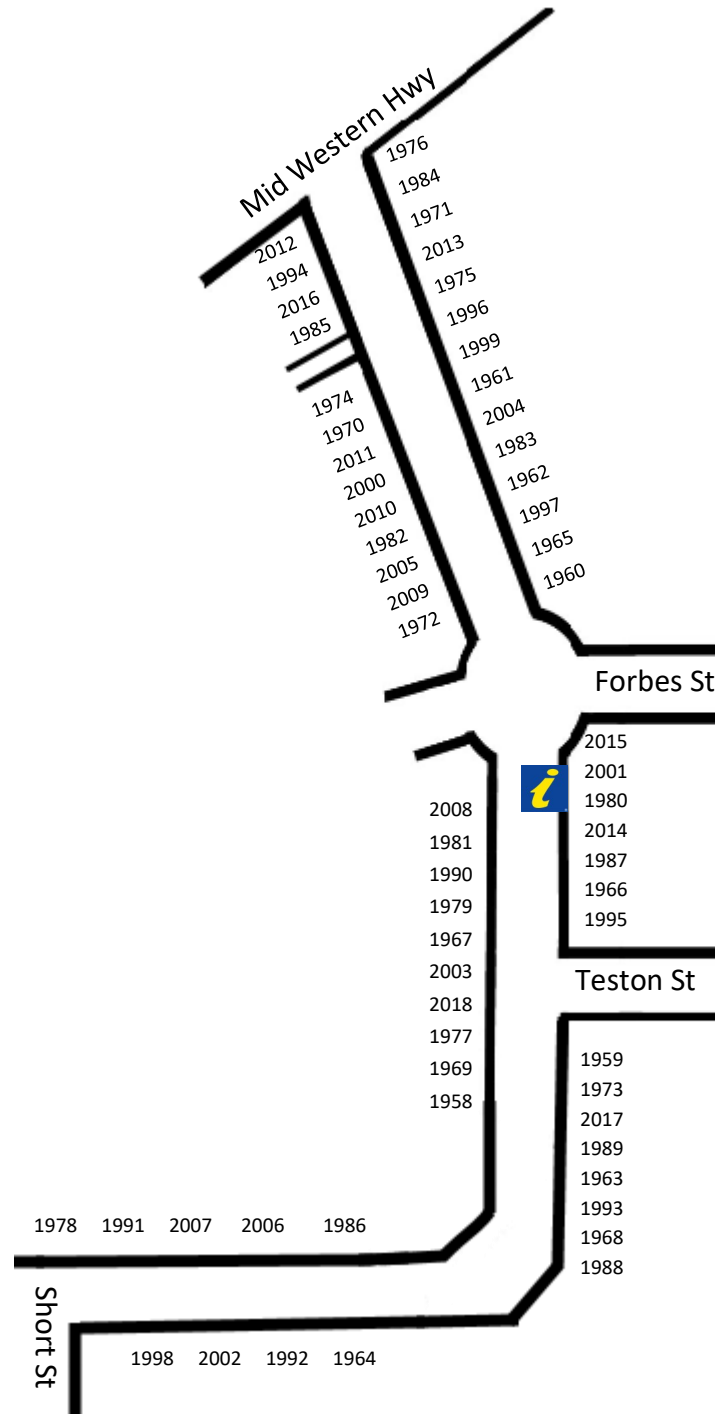
In a special meeting called in November 1957, the then Headmaster of the Grenfell High School, Mr Harold Goodwin, moved that an annual festival be held to commemorate the birth of Henry Lawson at Grenfell. The festival was first held in 1958 and has continued ever since. The Festival is held in the week leading up to and including the Queen's Birthday long weekend in June.

The festival is named "The Grenfell Henry Lawson Festival of Arts" and it seeks to promote and attain recognition for aspiring Australians in the fields of poetry, writing, composing, painting, and television.

Statuettes executed in bronze by Michael Mandelc are a feature of the Festival and are presented each year at the Awards Dinner. They are awarded to the overall winners for the Art, Photography, Short Story and Verse competitions. The statuettes have gained considerable prestige throughout Australia.

Walk of Fame Plaque Locations

To commemorate the 50th Henry Lawson Festival of Arts in 2007, plaques honouring each official guest were laid in the Main Street footpaths.
